# \$250,683 Awarded in Grants!

Each year, the AKRFW provides grant funds to nonprofits for projects that focus on breast cancer issues. Since 1993, the AKRFW grant program has funded more than **\$5.7 million** in grants covering a wide range of breast-cancer related programs. While the majority of funds raised stay in Alaska, up to 30% may be donated to fund important research. Following are our eleven 2024 grant recipients:

**Affinityfilms, \$10,475.** Create multi-media designed to raise awareness on two important topics for women living with breast cancer: Metastatic Breast Cancer and Genetic Testing.

**Alaska Community Action on Toxics, \$25,875**. ACAT is an environmental action organization with a statewide focus. The focus for this year's funding will be on decreasing the incidence of breast cancer in young women by creating an awareness of environmental toxins on their health, now and in the future.

**Alaska Literacy Program, \$2,000.** The refugee and immigrant population is a specific target group in need of reliable information and services from trusted sources. Funding will be to train Peer Leader Navigators in gaining knowledge of breast cancer screening, prevention and resources to share with this target group.

**American Cancer Society, \$12,500.** Funding to develop an Artificial Intelligence based technology to better predict future risk of breast cancer based on mammography images and risk factors; and develop an AI-based technology based on mammography images that predicts risk accurately and equally across women of all racial and ethnic groups.

**Breast Cancer Detection Center of Alaska, \$25,000**. Funding supports the BCDC Mobile Mammography program based out of Fairbanks. This program travels to remote Alaskan communities, providing quality services, regardless of ability to pay.

**Casting for Recovery, \$18,000.** This program is geared to survivors of breast cancer, in using the power of nature through the therapeutic sport of fly fishing. This unique and successful concept marries the physical therapy of fly fishing with emotional, physical and social support through their Alaskan breast cancer fly fishing retreat program.

**Kachemak Bay Family Planning Clinic, \$40,000.** KBFPC reaches a significant number of medically underserved women for outreach and no-cost early detection services on the Kenai Peninsula. Their range has expanded from Cooper Landing to Kachemak Bay. In addition to increasing women's access to screening exams, their well-documented outreach efforts educate women on the impact of exercise and dietary choices on overall health and breast health.

**Maniilaq Health Center, \$12,233.** Funding is for a 3-day retreat for AK Native women from the Northwest Arctic Borough with breast cancer. Goal is to create shared Inupiat community with those experiencing breast cancer.

**Providence Alaska Medical Center, \$25,000.** This successful project focuses on providing, at no cost, mastectomy, lumpectomy and lymphedema supplies that are not reimbursable by Medicare, Medicaid or other health insurance policies to patients experiencing breast cancer.

Max Kullberg- UAA Research Professor, \$57,500. Project: *Eliminating Breast Cancer Immune Suppression using Myeloid Targeted nanoparticles*. This research project will build upon previously funded work and develop a novel therapy that could readily translate into the clinic, the C3-liposomes will be used to improve immune recognition of the human tumor associated antigen mucin 1.

**Wild Energized Life (WEL), \$22,100.** Funding to provide scholarships for women with a breast cancer diagnosis to be part of a 12-week program to provide weekly nutrition and mental health sessions.
