But remembering the lessons of the last two years, the 2022 Run will be a hybrid event. We will have the in-person Run as well as a virtual Run. This will allow our participants, near and far, to join in Alaska's largest all-women running event at the level they feel most comfortable.

2021 was the second virtual Run and like 2020, it was a success. We had nearly 3,500 participants representing all 50 states, plus DC. While it was a successful year, we're pretty certain we all miss meeting in person, so it is exciting to be gearing up to once again see a wave of pink flowing along our city trails. And to add to the excitement, this year is the Run for Women's 30th annual event and we will be rolling along on a new and beautiful course.

The generous participant and donor contributions allowed us to continue our grant program, awarding \$201,270 to 12 grantees focused on breast cancer research, education, prevention and detection. The Run has raised over \$5.3 million since 1993 to help further the cause of fighting breast cancer with most of the money raised staying in Alaska.

The last two years also made us realize support from our donors was more important than ever – and that is something we never take for granted. Because of being virtual we had to get creative in honoring and recognizing our donors and we did that with exciting promotional materials, videos, interactive websites and more. And of course, with this being our 30th year, there will be lots of great coverage and activities on our new infield!

\$201,270 Awarded in Grants!

Each year, the AKRFW provides grant funds for special projects that focus on breast cancer issues. 2021 continued to be a tough year for non-profits, so we are very grateful for our donors and participants whose generous support enabled us to make these grant awards. Since 1993, the AKRFW grant program has funded more than \$5.3 million in grants covering a wide range of programs related to breast cancer. While the majority of funds raised stay in Alaska, up to 30% may be donated to research organizations. Following are our twelve 2021 grant recipients:

- Affinityfilms, \$10,000. Supports the dissemination and distribution of two visual arts projects: "Not So Swell" documentary focusing on lymphedema and "Pandemic Portraits in Pink" highlighting women currently in breast cancer treatment during a pandemic.
- Alaska Community Action on Toxics, \$20,000. Funding will build on work done over the past several years by educating women, healthcare providers and policymakers about the connection between harmful chemicals and breast cancer. This year's focus will be on the impact of breast cancer among Alaska Native women. This is phase 2 of the project in partnership with the Alaska Native Community Health Aide Program.
- Kachemak Bay Family Planning Clinic, \$30,000. Women's Health Outreach Program. This clinical provider reaches a
 significant number of medically under-served women on the Kenai Peninsula and villages across Kachemak Bay. Their
 contribution to outreach is significant through door-to-door visits in rural settings.
- Maniilaq Health Corporation, \$5,270. Funding is provided to support lodging expenses for women coming to
 Kotzebue for breast imaging, as well as for beginning development of a future breast cancer education project.
- Let Every Woman Know, \$8,000. Provides scholarships for breast cancer survivors to take part in their 'Extra Toughs' program. This integrated team approach was designed to support weight loss, healthy lifestyles, exercise and survivorship for women with breast or gynecologic cancer.
- **Breast Cancer Research Foundation, \$40,000.** This organization works with more than 230 clinical researchers and maintains an A+ rating from Charity Watch. Funding provides support for 16 existing clinical trials. The trials address preventive, treatment and quality of life issues in breast cancer patients.
- **Breast Cancer Detection Center of Alaska, \$24,000.** Provides funding for mobile mammography services, focusing on under-served women, primarily in remote Alaska and at a fixed site in Fairbanks.
- **Providence Alaska Medical Center, \$5,000**. This project will provide free post-mastectomy supplies that are non-reimbursable to breast cancer patients.
- Alaska Run for Women Mammogram Program, \$15,000. Administered by Anchorage YWCA. Provides access to mammography services for medically under-served women and men.
- Casting for Recovery, \$19,000. Program is geared to breast cancer survivors, using the power of nature through the therapeutic sport of fly fishing. It marries the physical therapy of fly fishing with the emotional support of group therapy. Funding will support two retreats: Kenai Peninsula and Ketchikan.
- American Cancer Society, \$10,000. Funding is in partial support of an ACA-sponsored clinical research project entitled 'A Precision Medicine Approach to Breast Cancer Early Detection'.
- YWCA Women's Wellness Program, \$15,000. Funds will support outreach and education efforts in the Anchorage
 area targeting women who are least likely to complete regular screenings, including but not limited to low-income,
 immigrant and refugee communities, homeless women and under-insured women.
